Murdo's role involved the provision of specialist equipment, environmental adaptations (via DFG), use of assistive technology, moving and handling training and networking multi-agency services.

Murdo has experience in networking independent therapists and providing clear instruction to them on areas of need to focus their intervention. Murdo is skilled in coordinating support packages varying from small teams of 1-2 support workers to full teams providing 24-hour support packages. Murdo believes that the provision of external support packages can initially seem intrusive and that building a relationship with the client and their family is key to assessing the correct level of support required for care to be successful.

As an Occupational Therapist Murdo is passionate that his client's activities should reflect their own life goals, facilitate development of life skills and provide fulfillment. Murdo aims to empower his clients to achieve structure by identifying meaningful activities and assessing the level of support required to facilitate their participation. Murdo has enjoyed supporting clients to participate in wheelchair sports, outdoor adventure activities, DJ courses, plan holidays and participate in voluntary and paid employment.

Murdo is familiar with current health care legislation such as the recent Care Act (April 2015) he works with clients to ensure they receive eligible services and funding from statutory services and works alongside these services to supplement provision when required.
